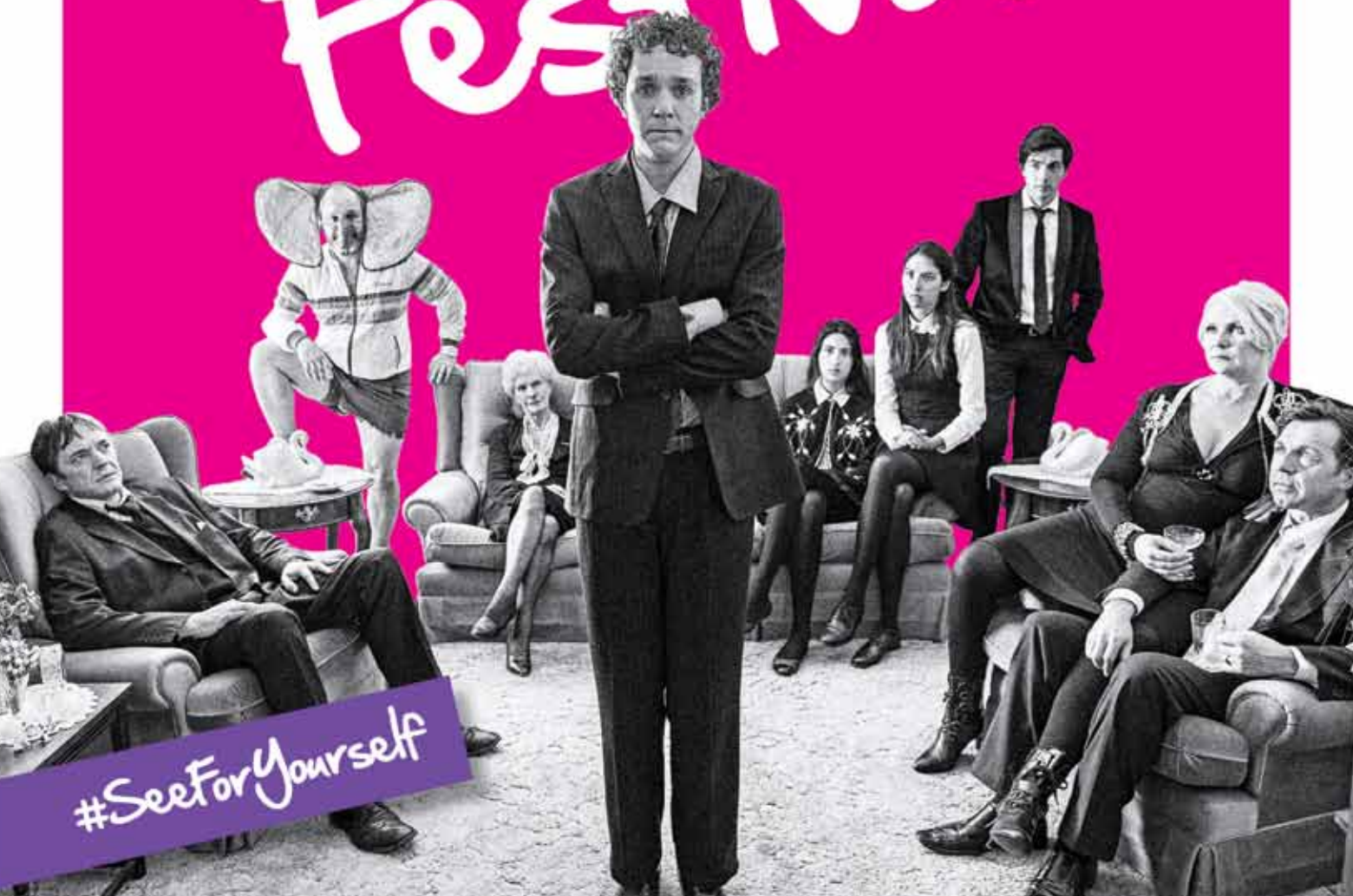

I was about ten years old when I first realized that I was attracted to boys and not girls, and that knowledge made me feel completely isolated, afraid and alone. Growing up in a quiet cul-de-sac in the suburbs of Toronto, I spent countless hours glued to the TV, captivated by Steve Austin, Pa Ingalls, and Wonder Woman's confidant, Colonel Steve Trevor—and not because of their acting prowess.

Another TV character, however, helped me understand my feelings and realize that there were people like me out in the world: Jodie Campbell (Billy Crystal) from the sitcom *Soap*. Although he was often the brunt of easy jokes, the out-and-proud Jodie was an inspiration to me and helped me realize there were other queer people beyond my white picket fence.

For so many of us when we were young and coming to terms with our sexual orientation and gender identity, it was the fear of being alone that paralyzed us and kept us from being true to who we are. Today, there are more resources and many

out visible role models. But the coming out process can still be fraught with insecurity, bullying and rejection.

This is why organizations such as Inside Out and events like the Toronto LGBT Film Festival are relevant today. In addition to providing a showcase for the best Canadian and international queer film, the Festival provides an opportunity for us to see our lives and experiences reflected on screen, and continues to be a powerful venue for our communities to come together in celebration, reflection and support.

Two common themes in this year's program are coming-of-age and coming out, and these films are a worthy addition to the queer cinema canon and should not be missed.

As always, thank you to our funders, sponsors, donors, members and advertisers, and to the brilliant team with whom I am fortunate to work every day. Further thanks to all our volunteers, including our committed Board of Directors, and to the artists for sharing their talent and imagination on screen. Finally, a special thanks to you, our audience, for continuing to support the Festival and for being a big part of what makes Inside Out so special.

Enjoy—and I will see you in the dark.

Growing up is never easy. Queer cinema has certainly had its share of growing pains, too. In recent years, though, we've noticed a marked shift in LGBT storytelling as it moves into adulthood. With this growth and maturation comes rebirth; a reframing of our Queer stories by a new generation of LGBT people as evidenced in our selection of movies at Inside Out this year, many with one recurring theme: coming-of-age.

These films, however, are not your typical coming-of-age and coming out stories. Yes, these are stories of discovery, young love and heartbreak, but they are being told by a new, informed generation of Queer. This new generation of storytelling is perhaps best evidenced with our Opening Night film (and *Berlin Film Festival Teddy Award Winner*) *The Way He Looks*: a heartwarming story about a blind teenager who falls for the new student, and gives new meaning to the old adage, 'Love is Blind.'

In fact, each of our gala films serves as a transition and, as such, anchors our personal and collective journeys. Our Centrepiece Gala, *Love is Strange*, gives voice to an aging generation of LGBT people, focusing on a relationship that is transitioning after 39 years, and our Closing Gala, *52 Tuesdays*, tells a story of parallel transitions—a mother who transitions to male, and his daughter who transitions from teen to young adult.

This common thread truly reflects what is happening in Queer cinema right now, suggesting a growth past that awkward adolescent phase of New Queer Cinema; a new phase equipped with the tools to help us celebrate an awareness of our past, to explore the present with new vision, and to look confidently toward a future yet unwritten.

Growing up may never become easier, but at least we can claim to be equipped with the tools to try. These are our stories and we can't wait to share them with you.

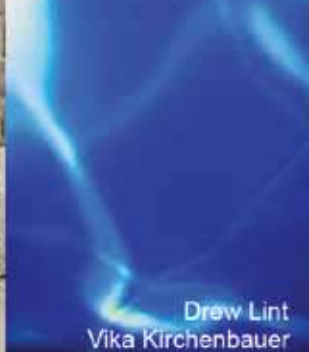

Salvation Army takes a sensitive look at the intersection between race, class and sexuality, and is a multilayered exploration of what it means to be an outsider.

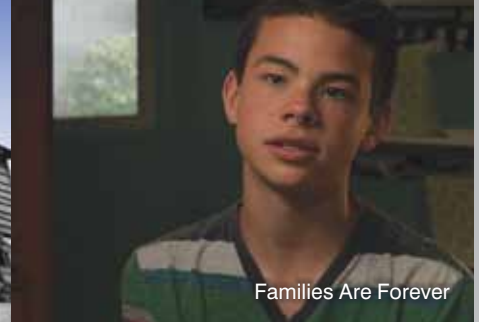

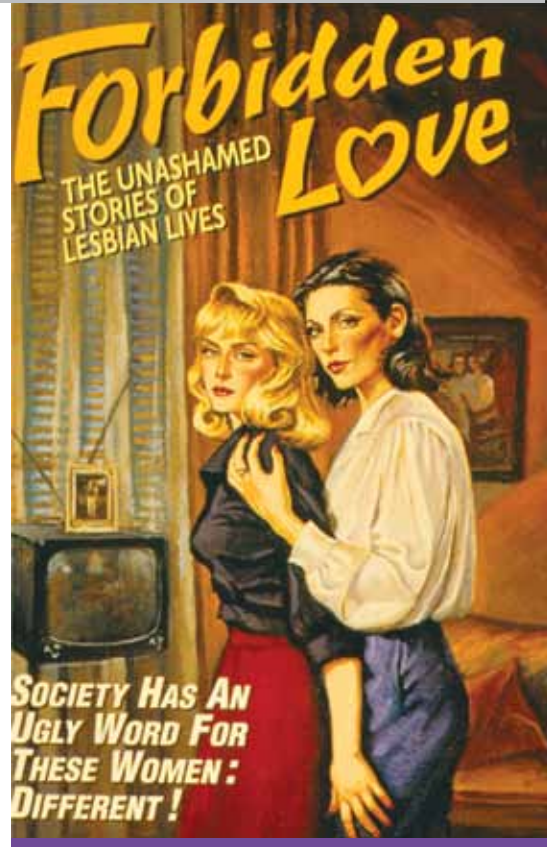

Inside Out is pleased to partner with the National Film Board of Canada and the Berkshire Conference to present a screening of the iconic Canadian lesbian documentary *Forbidden Love: The Unashamed Stories of Lesbian Lives*, now lovingly remastered in HD.

Forbidden Love is a compelling, often hilarious and always rebellious examination of the rich history of Canadian queer women’s experiences in the mid-20th century. Contemporary interviews, archival footage and a stylized fictional narrative based on the pulp novels of the 1950s are woven throughout this simultaneously funny, heartbreaking and empowering film.

The women interviewed in *Forbidden Love* recount stories about their first loves and their search for the places where openly gay women gathered in urban centres. Against a soundtrack of pop hits, the women’s coming-of-age in the 1950s and 1960s is explored with grace, humour and irreverence. The documentary offers an affecting portrait of a community once consigned to silence and exile, and escorts them out of the closet.

The screening will be followed by a discussion with the film’s directors and special guest B. Ruby Rich, moderated by Susan G. Cole, Senior Entertainment Editor of NOW Magazine.

Raising the tension and the stakes throughout the film's four chapters, Campillo deftly kicks the action into high gear with a heart-pounding finale, producing a mesmerizing and provocative drama about solitude, desire, love and territory.

As a temporary solution, George crashes with gay cop neighbours (Cheyenne Jackson and Manny Perez), while Ben moves in with his workaholic nephew, Elliot (Darren Burrows); Elliot's write-from-home wife, Kate (Marisa Tomei), and their teenage son, Joey.

As Ben and George struggle to secure a new apartment, the pain of living apart and their presence in two foreign households test the resilience and relationships of everyone involved.

Propelled by exquisite performances from Lithgow and Molina, a powerfully understated turn from Tomei, and solid support from the remaining cast, *Love is Strange* is a tender drama infused with gentle humour. The film's subtle intimacy draws the audience into the extraordinarily ordinary lives of George and Ben, and will leave you in love with their love and devotion.

But the man who put Casey Donovan and Bill Harrison on the map actually had a series of successful careers both before and after his time as a porn pioneer.

Jim Tushinski, who led a master class at Inside Out in 2012 with this very project, has created a fascinating biography of Wakefield Poole that opens up our understanding of this most remarkable man. As child radio star, Broadway dancer and choreographer, and New York gallery darling, Poole's pre-porn years were already rich and varied.

The unprecedented auteurship and lyrical aesthetic Poole brought to *Boys In The Sand* changed the way people thought about pornography and the way gay men felt about themselves. After Poole's filmmaking career foundered in the mid-70s,

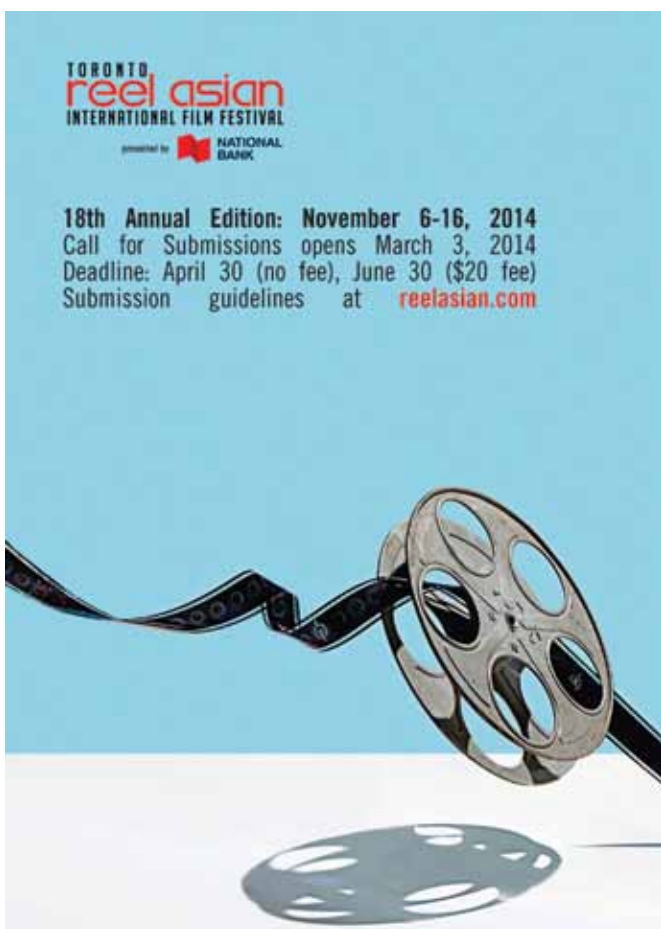

This comprehensive behind-the-scenes documentary follows two couples—and the whip smart team that selects and supports them—who challenge California's Prop 8, a 2008 ballot initiative designed to thwart the recognition of same-sex marriage in the state.

Kris Perry and Sandy Stier, parents of four boys, were married in 2004 during a brief period when San Francisco City Hall issued marriage licences, but the women later received a letter telling them they weren't legally married. Paul Katami and Jeff Zarrillo, together since 1998, want to marry for the sake of the family they're planning.

The foursome's likeability, along with polished, persuasive filmmaking, transform what might have otherwise been dry legal proceedings into a story that's clear, compelling and likely to moisten a few eyes. The arguments of the couples' legal team send conservatives running—and even cause some major opponents to switch sides.

The pair cruise Republican ladies outside of conservative clothing store Talbots, accommodate the surreal kinks of their clientele, and negotiate with a shady merkin salesman, all the while trying to reconcile their differing feelings for each other.

Olnek reunites leads Haas and Monahan in this awkwardly charming absurdist adventure where chemistry and razor-sharp comedic timing shines through.

TORONTO LGBT FILM FESTIVAL

Taking place over 11 days, the Festival draws crowds of close to 35,000 to screenings, artist talks, panel discussions, installations and parties that highlight more than 200 films and videos. In 2009 Inside Out welcomed RBC Royal Bank as the Presenting Sponsor for the Festival, and in 2011 the Festival moved its screening to state-of-the-art TIFF Bell Lightbox, thereby increasing its attendance, media coverage and industry presence and solidifying Inside Out's reputation as an international leader in the presentation of queer film.

OTTAWA LGBT FILM FESTIVAL

Since 2007, Inside Out has produced a four-day festival in the Ottawa-Gatineau region. With the support of Presenting Sponsor RBC Royal Bank, the area's queer communities have embraced the event. Inside Out has continued to build partnerships with local businesses and LGBT organizations and has experienced healthy growth in annual attendance, the 2013 Festival attracting more than 4,000 attendees to 14 film programs and parties.

FOUR-PLAY SCREENING SERIES

Inside Out maintains its year-round presence through a series of film screenings held at TIFF Bell Lightbox. The series selects the best LGBT films from the international festival circuit, bringing them to new audiences and supporting the work and development of emerging filmmakers.

OUTTV POST-PRODUCTION FUND

The Inside Out OUTtv Post-Production Fund has been established to provide financial assistance to Canadian lesbian, gay, bisexual, transsexual and transgender filmmakers whose work is consistent with the goals of Inside Out. The Fund seeks to provide an essential source of funding for LGBT artists who are struggling to secure the funding needed to complete their works.

QUEER VIDEO MENTORSHIP PROJECT

In 1998, with the support of Charles Street Video, Inside Out initiated the Queer Video Mentorship Project to provide opportunities for youth to learn video production with one-on-one mentorship and training from professional artists. Since 2010, the QVMP has evolved to become an intergenerational initiative that includes youth and elder participants.

After completion, the works are screened at the Inside Out Toronto LGBT Film Festival and many have gone on to play at festivals around the globe. Each year the videos are compiled on DVD and distributed free to schools and community organizations. To date, more than 100 new filmmakers have created work through the Project.

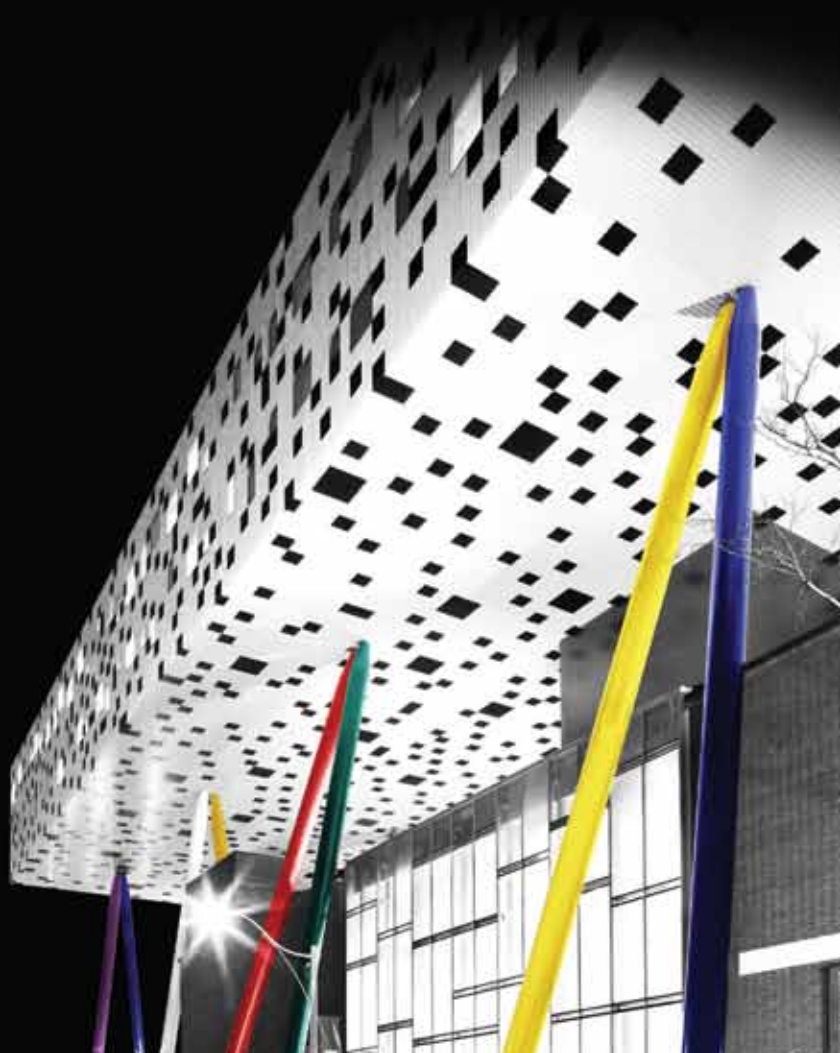
