

About Inside Out

In addition to bringing Toronto's 2SLGBTQ+ communities together in celebration of the best queer film from Canada and around the world, Inside Out, for more than three decades, continues to challenge attitudes and change lives with the following initiatives:

Ottawa Film Festival

An annual fall festival featuring local, national and international films, the Ottawa Film Festival presents upwards of 25 diverse films – both shorts and features – made by and about 2SLGBTQ+ people of all ages, races and abilities, and offers special events that include artist Q&As and parties.

Inside Out Screening Room

Inside Out works with the 2SLGBTQ+ film community to bring exclusive previews and special presentations to Inside Out audiences throughout the year. These digital screenings are always available Ontario-wide and, occasionally, across Canada.

The Library

The Library is a resource provided by Inside Out, Canada's largest presenter of 2SLGBTQ+ film. It's a place for youth, educators, and community organizations across Canada to access 2SLGBTQ+ short films that are accompanied by educational materials.

RE:Focus Fund

Established in 2018, Inside Out's RE:Focus Fund aims to address industry inequities by providing direct financial support to women, non-binary, and trans filmmakers relating 2SLGBTQ+ stories. Founded through a lead gift from Martha McCain, the fund has distributed, since its creation, more than \$150,000 in festival travel grants, post-production funds, and professional development programs for filmmakers.

Inside Out's International Finance Forum

Inside Out's International Financing Forum (IFF) is the first and only 2SLGBTQ+ finance forum of its kind. Now entering its sixth edition, the Forum provides 2SLGBTQ+-identified producers, writers and directors, who are creating 2SLGBTQ+ content, an opportunity to move their feature projects forward by way of professional development, mentorship, and a platform from which to pitch their projects directly to top-level international industry executives and decision-makers.

Pitch, Please!

Competitors present a short, two-minute pitch to a jury and audience, with one winner taking home a \$5,000 production grant. This year's competition will take place on Saturday, June 4th, at Artscape Sandbox and will include live and virtual presentations from filmmakers in Toronto and from around the world.

Out On Set

Out On Set is a database for North American 2SLGBTQ+ film & TV crew and creative talent. Out On Set is a joint initiative created and developed by OUTtv and Inside Out to connect production companies, agencies and networks to queer and trans talent within the screen industry.

outACTRato:

Queer Your Stories

Presented in partnership with outACTRato, the annual Queer Your Stories: Short Film Competition is open to queer ACTRA Toronto members and provides financial and in-kind production support and a screening for one winning team at the Inside Out Toronto 2SLGBTQ+ Film Festival. Catch this year's winner, *Save the Date*, screening in Local Heroes.

Inside Out's Strategic Plan

Over the past year, Inside Out's strategic planning committee and external strategic planning consultant have collected feedback from community members and key stakeholders to develop our 2022-2025 strategic plan. Community input has been a focal point of this process to ensure that Inside Out clearly understands how our festival can connect with our audiences.

Thank you to all members and stakeholders for sharing your invaluable

insights. Your contributions will help shape Inside Out's strategic goals to better serve the community.

The strategic planning process involved studying survey data and conducting focus groups with key stakeholders to engage in thoughtful and informed discussions about the future of Inside Out. Our management team, staff and Board of Directors collaborated in these discussions and we are excited for our organization's future and for the strategic goals we have set in place.



The strategic plan will be centred on four core pillars:

Equity and Accessibility is vital for Inside Out to authentically engage with both current and new audiences. Fostering an inclusive environment requires an accountable and actionable commitment to equity and accessibility.

Programming Innovation will enable the Inside Out festival to attract audiences from the local community and around the world. The festival will explore new ways of delivering programs and will continue to engage in a dialogue with our audiences.

Education and Industry Development initiatives will allow Inside Out to have a leadership role in cultivating the current and next generation of 2SLGBTQ+ filmmakers so they can fulfill their potential by reaching local and global audiences, challenging attitudes and changing lives.

Community Engagement is essential for delivering impactful programming. By collaborating with diverse community members and stakeholders, Inside Out can stimulate meaningful dialogue and foster a sense of belonging.

In 2022, Inside Out will take the necessary foundational steps to position the team and resources to execute the strategic plan. We look forward to sharing the full strategic plan with you later in the year.

Hybrid Festival and Venue

The last two years have had a major impact on the way that Inside Out presents our annual festival, and in addition to the return of in-person screenings at TIFF Bell Lightbox the continued use of our digital platform will provide viewers Ontario-wide access to incredible 2SLGBTQ+ programming.

In-person screenings will take place in Cinema 1 at TIFF Bell Lightbox from May 26 to June 5. Digital screenings will be available on our platform starting May 26 at noon with the launch of our digital exclusive programming. As films premiere each day in-person, they will be added to the platform simultaneously for viewers across Ontario.

This Land

We wish to acknowledge this land on which the Inside Out Toronto 2SLGBTQ+ Film Festival is held. TIFF Bell Lightbox is located on the Treaty Lands and Territory of the Mississaugas of the Credit and the traditional territory of the Anishinaabe, the Wendat, and the Haudenosaunee. The territory is within the lands protected by the Dish With One Spoon Wampum Belt Covenant, an agreement made between the Haudenosaunee and Anishinaabe and allied nations to peaceably share and care for the resources around the Great Lakes. Today, the meeting place of Toronto (also known as Tkaronto) is home to many Indigenous peoples from across Turtle Island, and we are grateful to work on this land.



Digital Tickets

To purchase digital all access passes, ticket packages, or single tickets, visit our box office anytime at insideout.ca/boxoffice. All single tickets for digital screenings are valid for 48 hours after you press 'Play.' The All Access Pass allows for one viewing of all films on the platform, for one household. Access to all digital screenings, regardless of when 'Play' is pressed, will end at 11:59pm on June 5.

All festival films screening at TIFF Bell Lightbox will be accompanied with open captions or English subtitles (all languages will be subtitled, including English). All festival films screening via Cinesend will have the option to enable captions.

Ticketing, Venue and Box Office Accessibility

& All of our venues are wheelchair accessible. All of our venues welcome service animals, guide dogs, and a support person accompanying anyone with a disability.

Inside Out offers a discounted Reel Access 5-Pack ticket package available to students, seniors, underwaged patrons and patrons with disabilities. Valid for in-person and digital screenings during the 2022 Inside Out Film Festival. Must be in Ontario to view digitally.

Students, seniors, underwaged patrons and patrons with disabilities are eligible for a 15% discount on in-person and digital screenings.

What are the festival COVID-19 protocols?

Where can I get tickets, passes, or packages?

All Access Digital Passes, 5-Pack and 5-Pack Reel Access packages are available to purchase now at insideout.ca/boxoffice. Individual in-person and digital tickets will go on sale on May 6, 2022. If you are a member, your ticket packages and passes will be added into your account in advance of the festival.

How do I get tickets for in-person and digital screenings?

Please visit insideout.ca/boxoffice to view our full list of Inside Out films. When you find a film that you would like to watch, simply add it to your cart and proceed to the checkout. If it is an in-person screening, you will receive a confirmation email with your ticket attached. If it is a digital screening, you will receive a voucher code that will unlock access to that film on our Inside Out online portal at watch.insideout.ca.

Do Inside Out members receive member pricing?

Yes. Inside Out members receive discounts on Festival and year-round screenings, as well as a number of digital tickets depending on membership level. Find out more about Inside Out memberships at insideout.ca/memberships.

Can I share my All Access Digital Pass with friends and family?

No. Passes are tied to the purchaser's account and cannot be shared. Passes only allow for one stream per film, per household. Digital tickets may be purchased for other people, but the voucher code cannot be used more than once.

Can I refund or exchange my tickets?

Refunds and exchanges are not available. All sales are final, so please ensure your order is correct before completing your transaction.

I have not received my ticket voucher or confirmation email. What should I do?

Ticket vouchers and confirmation emails are sent automatically when an order has been made. If you do not receive an email within a few minutes of your purchase, please check your junk or spam folders. If you need any assistance beyond this, please contact boxoffice@insideout.ca.

Can I stream digital screenings if I am outside Ontario?

All digital screenings are geo-blocked to Ontario. You must be within the province to stream our digital programming.

Will there be rush tickets available for sold out screenings?

Unfortunately, due to contact tracing and reserved seating, there will not be rush ticketing at this year's festival. An allotment of same day tickets, however, will be released each morning depending on availability.

Artist Fiona Clark, a misfit in society and a fearless storyteller, has spent a lifetime championing the unseen – fighting for individuals, hidden communities and the land she inhabits.

In mid-1970s New Zealand, Fiona Clark discovered the power of her art while taking portraits of friends who happened to be drag queens. Since then, she has covered a wide range of subjects by capturing everything from people living with HIV and AIDS in the 1980s to the stars in the world of bodybuilding. Some of her most powerful work was inspired by a 1977 car accident that left her partially blind. Framing Agnes
